**Charles B. Jackson, Jr., B.S., M.Div.
Biographical Sketch**

Charles Jackson, Jr. was born and raised in Columbia, South Carolina to Mrs. Robin and Dr. Charles B. Jackson, Sr. He is married to the former Iva Gaymon of Paxville, South Carolina and is the father of three sons: Charles, III (affectionately called, "Tre"), Caleb Adolphus and Carter Alexander; and one daughter, Kayla McKenzie Jackson. What drives him daily is to see his wife happy and see his children succeed - They are his pride, his joy, his motivation, his heart and his love! They are what keep him driven and determined to be who they need him to be and who God has purposed him to become. From very humble upbringings, Reverend Jackson matriculated through the Richland District One school system, graduating with honors from A.C. Flora High School. He is a 2000 Cum Laude graduate of South Carolina State University, where he participated in a number of college activities, including the SCSU Concert Choir, Student Government Association, and Men's Basketball Team, along with pledging Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity and Alpha Kappa Psi Professional Business Fraternity. In the summer of 1998, he was selected to represent the entire SCSU Athletics Department at the Annual NCAA Leadership Conference in Orlando, Florida.

Reverend Jackson furthered his education at the Morehouse School of Religion on the campus of the ITC in Atlanta, Georgia. He was selected by the staff and students to give the sermon during the annual ITC Conference on Ministry on February 20, 2003. Reverend Jackson is a Fall 2002 inductee into the Theta Phi National Honor Society for Seminary Students. He graduated with Honors on May 10, 2003 and earned the Master of Divinity degree with a concentration in Homiletics. He was presented the Memphis Award for academic excellence and nominated as one of the Nation's Top 40 Seminarians to appear in The African American Pulpit magazine. He is currently in preparation to pursue the Doctor of Ministry degree in Preaching from Beeson Divinity School of Samford University in Birmingham, Alabama.

Reverend Jackson received his license to preach the Gospel on September 23, 2001, at the age of 21, and was officially ordained into the ministry on August 14, 2002. He is presently the happy and humble pastor of the New Laurel Street Baptist Church, Fairfield Road, Columbia, South Carolina, and also serves on the Pastoral Staff at the Brookland Baptist Church, West Columbia, South Carolina. He currently serves as Dean of the Gethsemane Baptist Congress of Christian Education, and is Past President of the South Carolina Baptist Fellowship of the Progressive National Baptist Convention. Reverend Jackson is also a committed member of the School Improvement Council for Blythewood High School, Blythewood, SC. He serves the United Way of the Midlands as a member of its Board of Directors, while also holding membership on the South Carolina State University Board of Visitors. He is clinically certified by Palmetto Health, having completed an extensive unit of Clinical Pastoral Education at Palmetto Baptist Hospital in 2004.

However, above all of his accomplishments, he believes that doing God's Will is primary, everything else is secondary. Reverend Jackson loves God, loves the people of God, and loves preaching God's Word. His favorite passage of scripture and firm conviction is Romans 8:28, "And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them that are called according to His purpose!"
